Stock will be at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center Tuesday afternoon, February 3<sup>rd</sup> so that you can view them prior to the sale. ### Sires:

**Justin Boots**, sire to all of the other studs we used. This is his last colt crop and will probably be the last chance to buy some of the older studs we are offering by private treaty. We have had numerous calls on them and are excited to generate this offering. Justin has been a very good producer and we are going to miss his offspring in the rodeo arena.

**Waynes World** a 10 year old bay stud out of the Cooper bloodline mare Alley Cat. He is a past NFR qualifier; all parents have been the NFR, as well as his mother's sire, Mr. T.

**Royal River** an 8 year old black stocking legged stud. They won the round on him at the NFR the year he went to Vegas and has won numerous Badland Circuit awards. His mother, Big Wild Fun also went to the NFR. This is the last colt crop out of Royal River. Most of his colts have Justin Boots' markings.

**Shot Gun** an 11 year old black stud. Shot Gun has stayed home and worked instead of traveling to the rodeos. We hauled him to some of the winter rodeos where he would get his cowboy into the short round. We used him in both the bareback and saddle bronc riding where he was also used in the short round himself. His mother came from the Hauck ranch and was also an NFR qualifier.

**Show Time** a 12 year old black-grey. Show Time is out of the NFR mare Show Time. Dan Mundorf purchased and hauled her after she went to the NFR her first year as a 3 or a 4 year old. Show Time was one of the late colts born that year thus he could have been out of Red Lizard or Justin Boots. That year we had Red Lizard for the early season then put in Justin Boots. Sparky thinks he looks like a Lizard colt. We also didn't haul Show Time much because we tend to leave the studs at home. When we did haul him they won a lot of checks on him in the bareback riding. His mother goes back to the Cooper bloodlines.
